

process management, business intelligence, business networks,

and information management, the project seminar is a distinctive

feature of the MSc programme in Münster. Students work in small

groups on a project, often based on real-life situations involving a

company. This independent team work with intensive supervision does not only foster conceptual and technical skills but also

problem-solving competencies and soft skills. Many students

say: a project seminar is their first real business mission.

An MSc degree in Information Systems will enable you to pursue a variety of careers. Organizations all over the world depend on experts that are able to understand, build, and manage complex business software solutions. Our graduates are sought after as software architects, IT (project) managers, IT-consultants, process managers, business network managers, in the area of business analytics or simply as a creative mind for a position that does not yet exist. The programme qualifies our graduates to assume high-ranking positions in business, academia, and public administrations.

> REQUIREMENTS AND APPLICATION

- Bachelor's degree in information systems or business informatics or related subjects
- > Interest in the interplay of information systems, computer science, statistics, and business administration
- Sufficient English language skills for non-native speakers:
 TOEFL (IBT) minimum 90 points (or equivalent certificates)
- Start of the programme: Admission in summer term (April)
 or winter term (October)
- > Application deadlines:
- > EU applicants: January 15th for summer term, July 15th for winter term
- Non-EU applicants: November 30th for summer term,
 May 31st for winter term

INTERNATIONAL


The Department of Information Systems provides you with many opportunities to spend part of your studies abroad. You can benefit from well-established partnerships with more than 100 distinguished academic institutions worldwide. In Münster, internationality becomes apparent through international students, courses led by international guest lecturers, or joint courses with different universities within the European Research Center for Information Systems (ERCIS), an international research network with its headquarters in Münster.

> STUDYING IN THE HEART OF EUROPE

Münster ranks among the most beautiful cities in Germany and was internationally awarded as most liveable city in 2004. Being a university town with Hanseatic traditions in the heart of Europe, Münster offers everything that makes studying here as comfortable as possible.
